Swansea River Rangers Project aims to create a network of volunteers stretching from the M4 in the North to the Marina in the South who regularly walk stretches of the River Tawe to provide us with important information about the condition of the river and encourage community action to improve it. Rangers will become part of a team of people fully trained in recording key indicators of river health and condition at regular intervals, organising litter picks and clean-ups when needed and regularly reporting on the general condition of the river and its surrounding environment to the wider network of rangers and stakeholders.

Full and free training will be provided in:

- Wildlife Identification and Survey
- Identification and Reporting of Aquatic Pollution Incidents
- Identification and Recording of Invasive Species
- River Safety.

All Equipment will be provided, and an opportunity to study River Restoration at OCN level will be offered to volunteers, although this is not compulsory.

Commitment Level: Walk the river as often as you like, but a minimum commitment of one walk every month along the same stretch is required. Walk distance can be negotiated to suit your own ability, and Rangers must Work in minimum parties of two.
