Summer Trip Saturday 22 AUGUST to St Fagan's National History Museum and Llanilltud Visitor Centre, Llantwit Major.

St Teilo's church, St Fagan's National History Museum

Depart from Waterfront Museum Swansea at 9.00am

- 10.00am The Chief Conservator of History and Archaeology at St Fagan's National History Museum will meet us at the front entrance on our arrival (from 10.00am) and will escort us in groups of 15 to the collection store to show us some of the original wall paintings from St Teilo's church. She will discuss the process by which the paintings were originally applied to the walls, the process of saving them before dismantling the building and of transferring the images onto the re-erected walls of the Church. Following the session you will be able to visit the Church, explore the rest of the site and have lunch.
- The five-seated buggy has been provisionally booked for this date and runs 11.00–13.00. This is recommended for anyone that has difficulty walking long distances.
- NB The indoor galleries are being renovated and are closed. There are café facilities on site, but these are a short walk from the main entrance (which is now to the far side of the car park). These are the Bwtri by the Manor House, the Gwalia Tea Rooms above the 1920s shop and the old Pottery beside the 1920s shop. The Museum Shop is now located in the old House of the Future. As a group we will have 10% off in the museum café and restaurant on a minimum spend of £5 per person and 10% off in the museum shop on a minimum spend of £5 per person
- 2.30–3.00pm Travel to historic Llantwit Major to see the Celtic stones in the Llanilltud Visitor Centre at St Illtud's Church. Guided tour and tea and biscuits 3.00–4.00pm. Leaflets are available. http://llanilltud.org.uk/visit/
